September Week 3, A: Cape Capture

Equipment
Scarves, at least 2 per child - more is better

| Set Up | Have scarves ready to go. |
| :---: | :---: |
| Trans-In | Children gather in Starting Position. They turn around with backs facing the teacher. Tuck one scarf in the back of child's shirt to make a cape. |
| Intro Qs | What do superheroes wear on their backs? (Capes) <br> What happens when superheroes lose their capes? (They get another one.) |
| Explain <br> The <br> Game: <br> When I <br> say GO! | Running in the same direction, try to capture a cape off a friend's back without having your cape captured. If your cape is captured, get a new cape from the teacher. |
| Trans-Out | Children pull their capes off their backs to use for Bridge Building. |
| Change Up | Older children can manage this game without running in the same direction. |

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## September Week 3, B: Bridge Building

Equipment: 2 different colored scarves per child

| Set Up | Children are holding 1 scarf each. Spread rest of scarves on the floor. |
| :---: | :---: |
| Trans-In | Children gather in Starting Position and choose a second scarf that is a different color from the first. |
| Intro Qs | If we pretend the floor is a river, and we don't want our feet to get wet, what do we need to get across? (a bridge) |
| Explain <br> The <br> Game: <br> When I <br> say Go! | Children use scarves to build a bridge from Starting Position. They must keep their feet on the scarves. <br> How to build bridge with Scarf 1 and 2: Place Scarf 1 on the floor right in front of you. Step on top of Scarf 1. <br> Place Scarf 2 in front of Scarf 1 and step on top of Scarf 2. <br> Reach around behind you and grab Scarf 1. Pull it around in front of Scarf 2. Step onto Scarf 1. <br> Repeat: Reach around, place, step. |
| Trans-Out | Children pick up their 2 scarves and go back to the Starting Position |

## September Week 3, C: Color Run

Equipment: 2 different colored scarves per child

| Set Up | Children each have 2 different colored <br> scarves. |
| :--- | :--- |
| Trans-In | Children gather in Starting Position. If <br> there is a large group, split it in half, <br> with 2 groups standing on opposite <br> sides of the room facing each other. |
| Intro Qs | What color scarves you are holding? |
| Explain | The teacher calls out a color. |
| The | If you are holding that color scarf, run <br> Game: <br> When I the opposite side of the room. <br> say GO! |
|  | Each time the teacher calls a color <br> they are holding, they must run to the <br> opposite side. |
|  | Remind the children that many <br> children will be running at the same <br> time. They must be careful and watch <br> where they are going. |
| Trans-Out | Ask the children to put the scarves <br> back in their storage container. |
| Change | For younger children, use one scarf <br> per child. |
| Up |  |

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## September Week 3, D: Frog Pond

Equipment: At least 14 Poly Spots

| Set Up | Place the spots on the floor in front of <br> the Starting Position, 4 in one row, <br> then three, then 4, then three. |
| :--- | :--- |
| Trans-In | Children gather in Starting Position. |
| Intro Qs | If you were green and you lived by a <br> pond, what would you be? If you are a <br> frog, how do you move? If you were a <br> frog, what would you sit on in the <br> middle of the pond? |
| Explain | The spots are lily pads in a pond. <br> Each child will take a turn hopping |
| Game: | across the pond, from two feet to two <br> feet, from lily pad to lily pad, to the <br> When I <br> say Go! |
| Trans-Out side. Take turns hopping back. | Return to Starting Position. |
| Change | For older children, add a challenge. <br> Up |
| Frog-eating spiders are on all the <br> green spots, so they must avoid the <br> green spots. Then, add spiders to <br> yellow spots. Then, add spiders to red <br> spots. |  |

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
